Rising to a Great Year

t our recent Board of Trustees meeting, our lay leadership and professionals gathered in Simon Hall




to bake challah. While this was certainly an educational workshop, the goal was not to teach us to knead or braid, but rather to work together, to share stories, and to deepen connections. It was a wonderful opportunity for each of us to slow down and savor what happens when we aren't rushing.

Moderated by Rabbi Joel Mosbacher, we discussed the origins of challah in the Torah as well as the difference between the steps we take to bake versus what our biblical ancestors had to do. After all, early Israelites could not go to the grocery store for Fleischmann's fast-rising yeast or bake in their temperature-controlled ovens.

We all worked together, assessing if someone's dough was still sticky or if it was ready for kneading. We collaborated to measure and to decide if our strands were the right size for

braiding. We had expert braiders as well as novices in the group, yet by the end of the evening, everyone produced something beautiful.

The surprises came when we took the time to share stories. While our dough was rising, we discovered shared experiences at bakeries far from Needham. We uncovered similar connections to food and holidays. Our shared traditions and experiences were just below



the surface, but during our typically hectic lives and agendafilled board meetings they rarely come up. Just like the bread that requires time for the yeast to grow and help our dough rise, connections and relationships take time. By dedicating our evening to slowing down and allowing relationships to develop, we laughed together, we worked, and we enjoyed ourselves as well as the fruits of our labor. Even better, we

came away as a strong, more connected board.

It is my sincere wish for this new year that each member of our wonderful TBS community finds the time to slow down, share stories, and deepen connections. I know that we will all be richer for it.

Combating Antisemitism in America: National Strategy to Community Impact


Adult B. Mitzvah Class



Is camp affordable?

Camp can be as expensive as a year at medical school, but it is more fun. Grants and/or scholarships are available for first-time campers from the CJP One Happy Camper program t-b-s.me/campgeneration, and TBS has its own Marjorie Silver Camp Scholarship for Jewish overnight camp. The scholarship mission states, "Temple Beth Shalom enthusiastically encourages families to choose Jewish summer camp for their children. We celebrate how Jewish camping experiences joyfully enrich and strengthen a child's Jewish identity." More details can be found on page 15 of the June 2022 Scroll, t-b-s.me/June22Scroll. It is important to note that many camps strongly believe that cost should not be a barrier to sending kids to this transformative experience and may offer their own scholarships or discounts.

Should my child go with someone s/he knows?

Some children go to camp with local friends or relatives or get the chance to be with cousins who are geographically separated. Others start fresh with fellow campers they've never met. Some families have attended the same camp for generations. We have TBS members who bring their children to the childhood summer camp they had attended in a foreign country. You could even send your child to a camp with one of our own clergy or staff in residence! There is no "right" way to choose a camp or camp situation; it's about finding what's right for your child.

How do I find out what camps are out there?

You may find our own abbreviated list of camps t-b-s.me/camplist to be helpful. Please pay special attention to those camps that have supported us by purchasing advertising in this "camp" issue of the Scroll! While the list may not include every camp available, it is a large list with narratives provided by the camps themselves. Word of mouth (e.g., through our TBS Community Bulletin Board) can help you learn about camps and about consultants who help families identify camps that feel right for them.


