Embracing the Present

At last, we have arrived at June: the front edge of summer. Gratefully, we look ahead towards days of more sunshine, warmth, and a blessedly different pace from the more marathon-like rhythm of autumn through spring. Those of us who are old enough to know better understand that before long, it will be Labor Day again... and the summer months will be behind us. It is precisely for this reason that we should take note of where we are in the cycles of time, and pause and consider the shape we would like these precious weeks to take. With whom would we like to spend more time? Upon what paths would we like to walk? From where would we like to watch the sunset? How often would we like to sit at Fenway? So often, our lives are a blur of running, generating, and striving – a series of days which merges from one to the next. As much as Judaism is a tradition rich in doing, just as importantly, it is a tradition that calls upon us to cease from our doing. Just as the rest notes thoughtfully placed within a piece of music make that work whole, it is the intentionally placed moments of mindful “pause” that enable us to experience the fullness and beauty of life.

Like so many in our community, this summer, Emily and I are experiencing an especially meaningful moment of pause as we beyond-joyfully celebrate this season of graduations. In May, Liana graduated from Brandeis and on June 4th, Jonah will be graduating from Needham High School. To say that we are a bit overwhelmed by it all would be an understatement. As we are thinking about Liana’s and Jonah’s “next steps,” Emily and I are finding ourselves reflective of how far they have come, where they are going, and of how truly proud and grateful we are.

There is a story that is told about the 18th century sage Rebbe Nachman of Bratzlav. It is said that one day, when he was looking out his window, he noticed his student, Chayim, running down the street. Reb Nachman called out to him: “Chayim, tell me, have you seen the sky today?” Puzzled by such a strange question, Chayim replied hesitatingly,

“Why, no. Not really.” The Rebbe continued: “Well, have you seen the street lately?” With greater certainty, Chayim responded: “Of course, I have. It is filled with people moving and doing – all pursuing their livelihood.” Reb Nachman continued: “Chayim, in 75 years... in 100 years... on this very street, there will be yet other people – traffic and tumult – just as there are today. And so, Chayim, I have to ask: What good is all of this commotion down below if we can’t take the time to look up at the sky?”

With summer almost upon us, as we acknowledge the rapid pace of life’s (“Chayim’s”) running, may we slow down long enough to embrace what is most precious. May the coming weeks be a time of renewal and restoration. And may this be a season to rejoice in the innumerable blessings of life, nature, friendship, and love.



My Meditation on Silent Prayer

Om Shalom Yoga Service

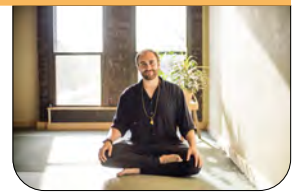
Friday, June 2, 7:15 PM TBS

Adult Learning and the Community Scholar Program

The mission of the Adult Learning Committee has always been to bring interesting and informative programming to our TBS community. When COVID struck in 2020 and shut down our in-person programming, Adult Learning needed to find a new way to keep the TBS adult community active and engaged. Under the leadership of Peter Mesnik, we began a partnership with the Orange County Community Scholar Program (CSP). Their accessible online programming flung open the doors of our synagogue to a world of information and adventure.

Founded in 2001, CSP is a nonprofit group committed to igniting passion for Judaism through a wide variety of adult Jewish education programs and experiences. For example, in January alone, Stephen Berk, professor of Holocaust and Jewish Studies at Union College, offered a four-part series on *Demystifying History*, focusing on Putin, Ukraine, and the Jews, which enabled a deeper understanding than news coverage alone could supply. Following on its heels was another four-part series, *From the Rise of an Empire to the Arab Spring: Understanding the Arab and Islamic World*.

CSP's offerings are varied. Some are in the form of a series, some a single presentation, some tours of distant places. To mention but a few, Howard Lupovitch, author of *A History of the Budapest Jewish Community*, offered a talk on Herzl's Budapest; Evgenia Kempinski, owner of Online Jewish Travel Club, spoke on the Jews of Argentina: "They sowed seeds and harvested doctors;" and David Horowitz gave an overview of Israeli current affairs, live from Jerusalem.

Each CSP program is interesting, informative, and enriching. And because TBS supports CSP, all you need to do to access a program is follow the link provided in the Temple's weekly news email, TBS This Week. An online search of CSP will also display present and future programs as well as a registration link.

Although established and supported in California by nearly a score of synagogues, CPS is also supported by several synagogues in New York, Washington D.C., and Temple Emanuel of Newton, as well as TBS. If you are interested in

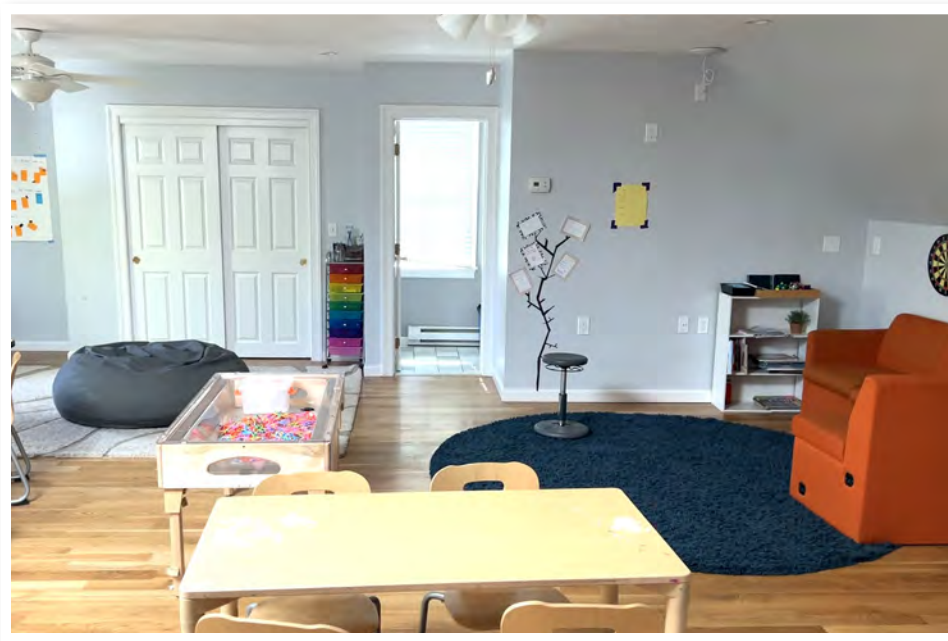
Mayim Tamid is a program where children come to TBS multiple days per week for integrated afterschool care and Jewish learning. It shares many characteristics with our once-per-week Mayim program, but it also has its own unique feeling. The children enjoy family-like group experiences, engage in Jewish content, share meals, play indoors and outside, and are part of the fabric of the broader TBS community. Mayim Tamid is designed to feel like a “home away from home” every day after school!

When TBS purchased the house at 28 Greendale Avenue, we were able to bring our vision of *Bayit* – a home atmosphere – to a new level! In addition to the four classrooms we continue to inhabit within the TBS building, Mayim Tamid has five brand new learning spaces within the walls of the Greendale property.

The main house, which was previously two apartments, is now two learning spaces: one on each floor. The renovations created a beautiful homey environment for this year's two first-grade Mayim Tamid classes. It was important for us to set up the space so it feels very different from school. After their busy school day, students need to feel like they are coming home when they arrive. On their first day in the new space, the children's reaction was, “This is not a classroom – it's a house!” Different rooms, interesting angles and corners, and a full-size kitchen allow for a cozy, warm atmosphere.

On any given day, you may find groups of children sprawled on the rug playing with Legos, reading books on a sofa in what looks like a living room, or eating at the kitchen table! Here are some comments from our first graders about the *Bayit*:

- Evie T.: It looks pretty different from my classroom at Newman. I like to play in the play kitchen inside the real kitchen!
- Evie S.: It actually used to be a house for some people; that is why we call it the *Bayit*, because it is a house in Hebrew!
- Gabby said that she loves taking her shoes off at the *Bayit*!

4th grade classroom (former garage)

The garage building originally had room for two cars and an office plus an upstairs apartment. It was completely renovated into three learning spaces, including two separate rooms on the first floor and one room upstairs. Different in style, the two first-floor spaces feel modern with new laminate wood floors and furniture appropriate for the 4th graders. The upstairs is spacious, has a skylight, and is furnished appropriately for 3rd graders. Here are some comments from the children:

- Maya A.: I like the big classrooms. They feel not too tight in space.
- Whitney K.: When we were waiting for the *Bayit* to be built, our classrooms were in Community Hall and it was noisy. I like that even though you can sometimes hear the other classroom, it is still quiet and you can have more private space.
- Elliot and Zachary said they like the size of their classroom and that they have a bathroom inside the classroom.

Starting as a small section of shelves and a few random boxes in the library, the archives now has its own space on the lower level of TBS. We have extensive holdings about the Temple's history, organized and stored in archival boxes to preserve them for posterity.

Among the earliest holdings in the archives:

- The 1952 minutes of the Needham Jewish Community Group, the precursor to TBS
- Almost all the issues of the *Scroll* since 1953
- Confirmation photos since 1963
- Time capsules since 1965



After finding copies the oldest copies of the *Scroll* lying around the library shelves, I realized the need to preserve these. The Board approved the Archives to become part of the library in January 2003. Lisa Rothenberg, the librarian, and I became co-chairs of the Archives Committee.

Preserving Our History continued...

Present

Current active members of the Archives committee, which I continue to co-chair, are Michael Bailit, Ken Davis, Margie Glou, Gary Goldman (co-chair), and – newly added this year: – Jeff Cotton, Peggy Gassman and Ben Spector. Margie was an original member and has served on the Committee for 20 years.

The Archives' first project was interviewing our founding members, many of whom were still alive in 2003. Margie and Alan Glou conducted the interviews, and the members' insights are preserved on CDs in the Archives. Michael Bailit notes, "Now, as the members of the founding generation dwindle, we will not lose the benefit of the oral history that they have been able to share with us."



The Archives also has interviews with most of the former Temple presidents. These have recently been digitized and will be placed on the Temple website.

In 2005, the Archives produced a video of the Temple history for the 50th Anniversary. We also created a time capsule scheduled to be opened on the 100th anniversary, in 2055.

In 2007 Joan Bycoff and I created the Walls of History, tracing our history by decade from the early 1950s to 2015. These large collages are mounted in the administrative corridor and on the lower level. They will be updated in 2025.

Also mounted on a wall in the lower level is the lion sculpture acquired from Temple Agudas Israel in Dorchester in 1972. It was lying unidentified in a closet before the Archives Committee rescued it and posted it with information about its history.

Another major project was documenting the origins of our Holocaust Torah. Working with a contact in Prague, we created a plaque that was dedicated and posted on the site of the former synagogue in Sobeslav, Czech Republic. It explains that a Torah from that synagogue now resides at our Temple.

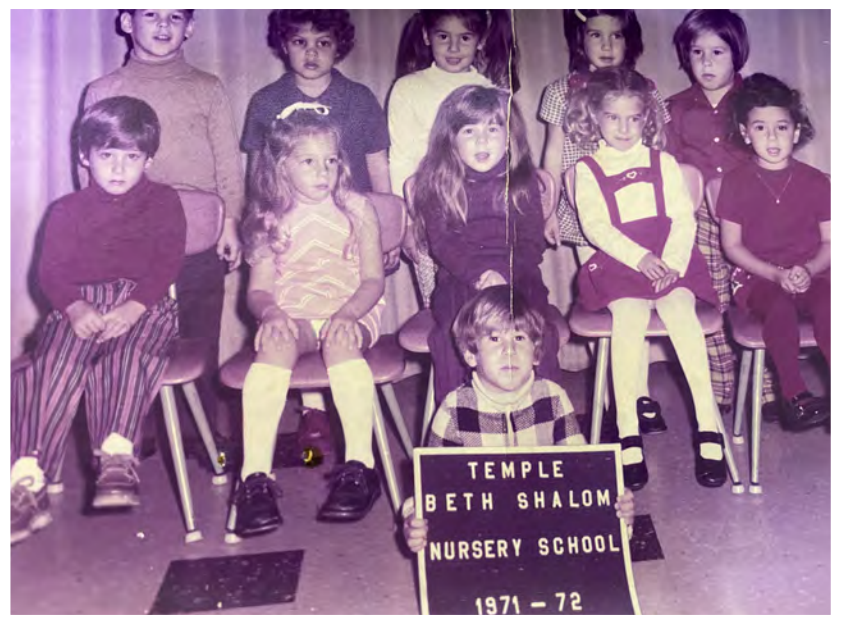
The Archives is always looking for materials about the past and to learn what history younger members might be interested in.

Outdoor Space

Everyone loves the playscape at TBS, but it can be challenging in size for our older children. With the greater amount of time that Mayim Tamid children spend at TBS, age-appropriate outdoor space is crucial. The *Bayit* has a fenced backyard, a safe driveway space, and other smaller play areas around the buildings. The children are able to kick a ball and play catch on the lawn, and drive scooters and dribble basketballs in the driveway. We have plans to add more features to offer greater variety for older elementary-age children. Outdoor play is a core practice in Mayim Tamid and having

additional areas to explore outside is a great bonus of the *Bayit*.

The move to the *Bayit* was extremely positive but also came with challenges.

We needed to adjust to a space that is a little more remote from the rest of TBS, figure out what should be available there for educators and children, create indoor and outdoor spaces that function well, transition children from one building to another, and create dismissal procedures that work for parents who have children in both buildings. Our creative team of educators worked hard to create structures and routines to make it work.

After spending a long time in temporary classrooms in the Community Hall, Mayim Tamid's move to the *Bayit* has been very exciting. The Mayim Tamid community is so very grateful to have a new place to call home! 🕯️

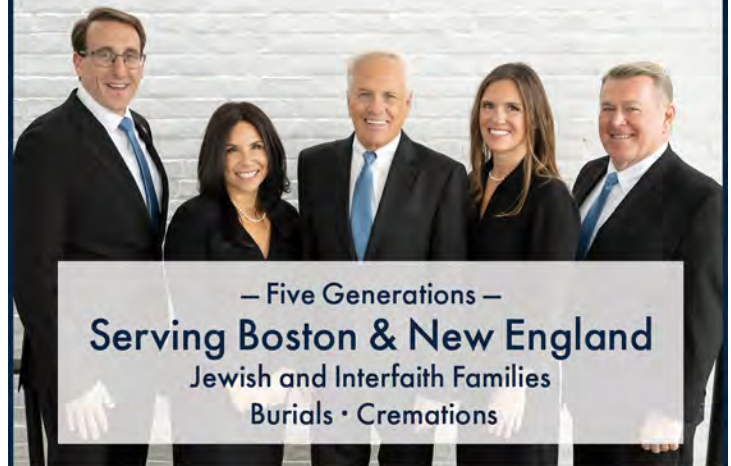

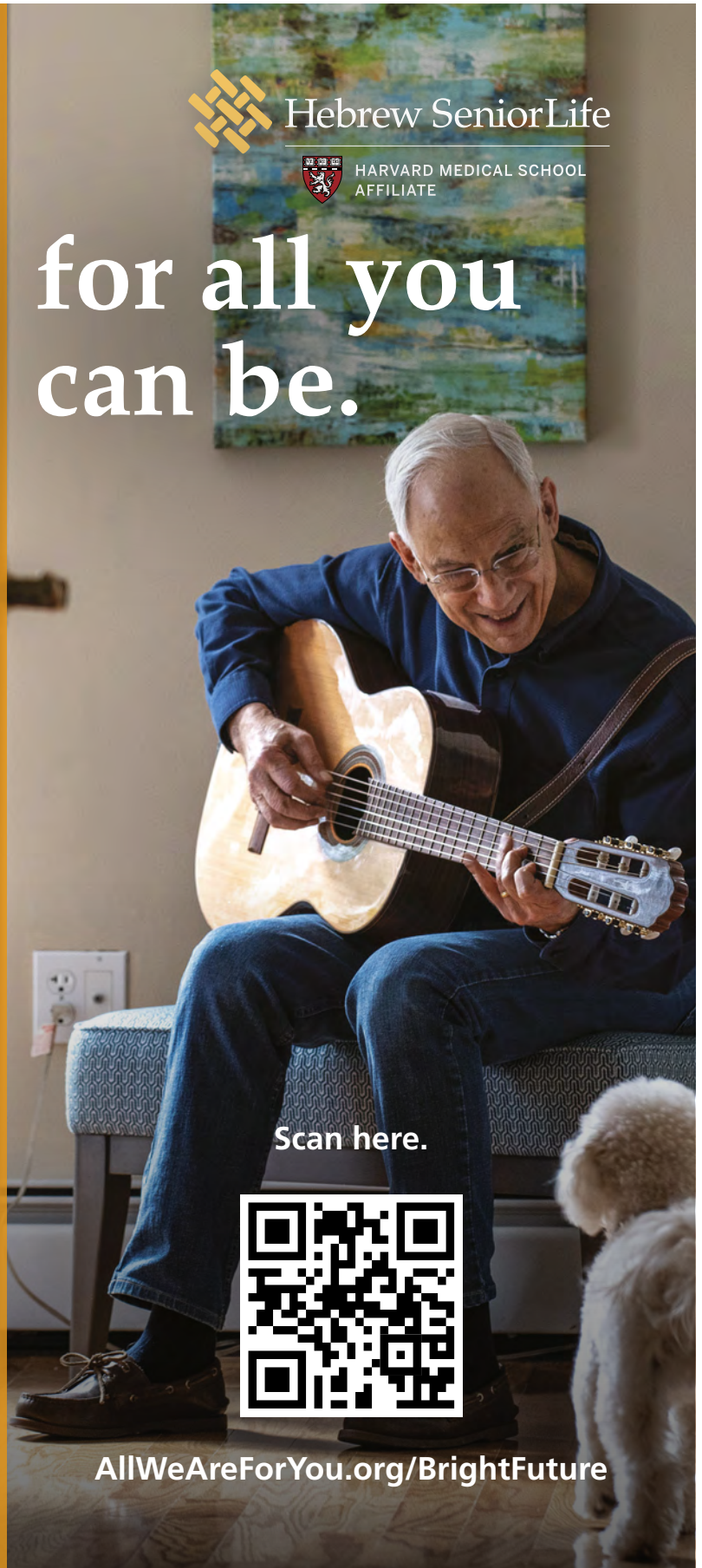
