Entering the Sanctuary

One of the primary goals of the weekly TBS Children's Center Friday Shabbat celebrations is for children to learn about the sanctuary, a special place for adults and children alike. The theme for our worship space is based on a text from the book of Exodus in which God commands the Israelites: "Build for Me a Sanctuary so that I might dwell amongst you" (Exodus 25:8). The designers of our space wanted anyone who entered this special room to feel God's presence, and so included elements intended to inspire a sense of warmth and community. The windows open out to the

armtn and community. The windows open out to the beauty of nature, allowing natural light and views of

the sky, and often, in the early evening, the sunset.









The design is intentionally simple, focusing on the ark and, most specifically, our five Torah scrolls. The ark doors are made of frosted glass so that the bright colors of the Torah covers are visible. The ark itself is designed to look like two hands (the darker wood on each side) embracing the Torah itself.

Our children learn that the sanctuary is a special place as they notice and appreciate the intentional design and beauty. The one- and two-year-olds can't wait to find their seats and take in their surroundings. While there, they know how to act in special ways. The three- to four-yearolds further learn that the sanctuary is a holy place where



we can be together with our community, celebrate, and talk to God. They become familiar with the parts of the sanctuary, identifying that the ark is the home for the Torah. By the time they turn five, children begin to learn about the many objects and symbols in the sanctuary that remind us of Judaism and identify the sanctuary as a place where we can gather with our



Jewish community. In the sanctuary, our children learn that participating in services ranges from joyful singing to quiet thinking.

As we call them up to the *bima* to lead us in song or prayer, children are developing a comfort with the Jewish traditions and beginning to see themselves as leaders of their community. Some children lead us through hand motions, others through singing, and others simply stand in front of our community. This experience of leading from the *bima* happens well before they become B. mitzvah, establishing an ease and eagerness from the youngest of ages.

For many of us, our encounters with the Torah have been limited, maybe holding it when we became b. mitzvah. As we engage a new generation in Jewish ritual, we want to provide

meaningful and regular experiences with the Torah. Each Friday, one class is given the honor of hosting the Torah as we sit together in the sanctuary. As a parent, grandparent, or teacher holds the Torah in their lap, children delight in the special up-close experience with the Torah next to them. At the conclusion of the service, the class is invited to help open the ark doors, view all the Torah scrolls, and get a prime view of the ark as the Torah is returned home. That is something special we do; it doesn't happen everywhere. Many adults even comment that it was their first time holding the Torah, as touching a Torah was forbidden to them when they were growing up. Our Torah wall hosts photos of the many who have held Torah during Children's Center services over the years. These early experiences with Torah and sanctuary enable comfort and confidence as our TBS children grow in their Jewish Temple home.





TBS Israel Adventure 2022: A Multi-Gene

TBS's biennial Israel trip led by Rabbi Jay and Emily Perlman resumed this past December. Hear from some of the travelers!

It was a wonderful nine days – a whirlwind tour of early mornings and long days packed with adventures.

Although I had been to Israel a few times before this, I had not been back in about 25 years, so I was unsure what to expect. The beauty of the Jerusalem stone and the connection to being Jewish does not change – it is quite amazing and indescribable. The fact that it was



the last three nights of Chanukah and there were *Chanukiot* everywhere and maybe only one Christmas tree was a great experience since we so often encounter the opposite here in the States.



We walked, we toured, we ate delicious food, we celebrated two amazing B.mitzvah at the top of Masada, and so much more!

Our favorites included *Yad LaKashish*-Lifeline for the Old, the jeep tour through the Golan Heights, visiting Safed (cobblestone alleys, artsy stores, old temple, mystical atmosphere),hiking up Masada, and for me personally being able to participate in Israeli dancing

in Israel.It was my daughter's first trip to Israel so it was meaningful to see things through her eyes as well.

I had visited *Yad LaKashish* when I was 16 and was in Israel for six weeks with my youth group. *Yad LaKashish* provides a place for elderly residents to learn a craft and to be an active, contributing member of society.

It touched me then to meet these elderly people who were making such beautiful things and had found their purpose each day. I got a little emotional seeing it again and seeing how much it has grown and how many people it has helped. My teen daughter in turn got emotional as well. She said we should be doing this in the States. I said, yes we really should! Needless to say, we spent a lot of time buying gifts there, as did many on the trip!

As Rabbi Jay said, "It was an adventure which created memories that will last a lifetime." We'll definitely be back (per my daughter)!

"Faith in the Future" Debby Beck, mother/grandmother



I went to Israel, and it was not my first time. I had been to the Western Wall before; I had walked the streets of Tzfat before; I had read the plaques at *Yad Vashem* before. For none of these things was this trip my first time.

But it sure felt like it was.

The Western Wall looks different in the evening, with a flash of lightning and a resounding *boom* of thunder. So different that it might not even be the same place; so different that I really *felt* it in a way I never had before.

Tzfat looks different at sunset, when the horizon is bright and beautiful, and the windows all reflect shades of orange-pink. So different that the city seems to have personality; so different that it seemed to be alive.





The plaques at *Yad Vashem* remind us that our people have not always had a place. We have not, until very recently, fit into the puzzle of the world. I understood this years ago, when I first went to Israel. But that was before I read *Night* by Elie Wiesel and had a Holocaust unit in *Etzim* and a WWII class in History. And, knowing what I'd learned, the difference between past and future struck me. Because we do really need to, as an entire world, learn from our mistakes, lest everything happen again.

I could go to Israel a million times, I realize, and it would never be the same. So going with classmates and family and friends all at once was really very special. It was another layer to the trip, and it made a remarkable place that much more remarkable.


